Attendance News



Please remember:

- If you are unsure if your child should come to school, please ask us as for most childhood illnesses they can be, unless of course they really are too unwell.
- If your child has been prescribed antibiotics 4 times a day - pop to the office and we can give these to your child at lunch time.
- If you feel your child is a little ill and needs Calpol during the day - pop to the office and we can give this to your child.
- Try to make appointments out of school hours where possible e.g. dentist.
- Where they do have a medical appointment in school time please consider if they need to be off the full day. If you have an appointment, it is important you attend school before the appointment where possible and return to school after the appointment.
