Dear parents, carers, families and friends,

What a busy week! We loved our Wonderful Wednesday and our non-uniform day today – and of course we have the joint Christmas Fair at SFSM after school today. We hope to see you there!

We have spotted many lovely Christmas jumpers today! If you have any Christmas jumpers that your child has outgrown, please donate them to school and we will arrange a jumper sale as soon as we have a few. With this in mind, so that your child gets as much wear as possible out of their Christmas jumpers or clothing, before they grow out of them, we would like to have a **Festive Friday for the rest of the term. Your child is invited to wear something festive every Friday in December, whether it be a tee-shirt, a jumper or sparkly tights!** We ask that they wear uniform for the rest of their outfit but just jazz it up on these special festive days e.g. school tee shirt and trousers, with a Christmas jumper!

For the last few years, staff in school haven't sent Christmas cards but have donated to a chosen charity instead. This year, with the help of the School Council, we have decided to donate money to a very important charity for our St Faith's family, Diabetes UK instead of buying and sending Christmas cards. We have chosen Diabetes UK because Ria, one of our wonderful Year 2's has Type 1 diabetes. Type 1 diabetes is a lifelong autoimmune disease that causes a lack of insulin, an essential hormone. It requires daily management with insulin injections and glucose monitoring.
